Library Procedures

The Guild library created for the use of members of the Guild, operates on the honour system. **Guild Library books may be borrowed for one month (from one meeting to the next meeting).**

Sign Out Procedures

1. Remove the sign out card from the pocket in the front of the book.
2. Record your name, telephone number the due date (which will be the **next** meeting –month and year only)
3. Give the card to the person at the library table. (If there is no card, ask the person at the library desk and they will either locate the card or make a substitute.)
4. The library staff will give you a due dates slip to insert into the pocket to remind you to return it the next month.
5. **A maximum of 3 books** may be signed out by one member.

To return a book, put the book in the return box and the library staff will handle the rest. If you forget your book(s) or need more time, there is no problem **as long as you inform the library staff!!** However, if you have kept a book longer than 3 months, an overdue charge of 1 fat quarter will be charged for each overdue book.

Have you ever wanted to experiment with different threads before buying them? Well, now you can! This is an "open thread bar" workshop - you bring your machine and I'll bring the threads.

Learn how to choose the correct needle, and how to overcome your fear of the tension dial. We'll discuss the properties of the different threads available today so that you can make an informed decision when choosing thread.

Various machine applications will be covered, such as - straight stitch, free motion, decorative embroidery, both raw edge decorative and invisible applique. Learn some nifty techniques using fusible and water soluble threads.

At the end of the day you will have a new perspective on threads and your own sampler as future reference.

Your \$5 kit fee will include a Topstitch 90 needle, prewound bobbin of Bottom Line, Handy Net, thread colour charts, and the opportunity to play with approximately 16 different lines of thread by Superior. Threads will be available for purchase after class.

A Handy Tip

I had a sweater that somehow my puppies had "used". I went to Wooly's, our local wool shop, for some advice to clean it and she told me about "eucalan", a no rinse delicate wash. So I washed the sweater with it and it turned out great, no marks, no smells.

When it came time to wash the pencil markings from a quilt, some of which were rather dark, I thought of the eucalan, and tried it. I 1/3 filled the bathtub with water and a few capfuls of the eucalan, then added my quilt. Making sure that all parts were underwater, I walked away, coming back about 2 hours later. All the markings were gone. I never had to rub any spots or anything.

Now the instruction on the bottle say that you do not have to rinse, but I wonder about residue, so I would rinse it also. I really like this stuff a lot.
